- Johannes Mann (10) served in Rev War, Springfield Associators. Enlisted Aug 21, 1775. Pvt. First Class, Sixth Company, Third Battalion, Pennsylvania Militia, under Captain Josiah Bryan. His eldest son John Mann also served, as a Pvt. with the Durham Township Militia of Bucks County under Captain George Heinlein in the Seventh Company, 3rd Battalion.
- Civil War. Jacob J. Ruth (1) Assigned Company I, 147th Pennsylvania Volunteers, 19 December 1863; served 8 mo. 20 days honorably discharged 9 Sept 1864 at Atlanta, GA.
